2022 Clerking Test

The 2022 CFA Clerking Program test consists of 90 questions; 25 focused on Show Rules, 31 focused on Ethics/ Etiquette and 34 on Mechanics. All show rules questions are covered in the May 1, 2022 – April 30, 2023 Show Rules.

The new Show Rules and Clerking Manual are included in this package. Both may also be downloaded as PDF files directly from CFA's website at <http://www.cfa.org>

This test was prepared as a refresher to our clerks with some show rules involving basic duties of the Chief Ring Clerk and Master Clerk. Please be sure to READ each question carefully before answering. Some of these questions are developed to address clerking issues that have come up during the past few years. Others are meant to remind you about some rules and procedures that may have been forgotten or overlooked. A particular emphasis has been placed on practical application of show mechanics.

Everyone will be answering the questions on Master Clerking. Please remember that any LICENSED Certified Clerk can fill the position of Master Clerk if no licensed Master Clerk is available to perform this function.

In order to pass this test and be relicensed or licensed, clerks must achieve the following minimum grades:

New clerking licenses for the period 2022-2024 will be mailed in July or August to all those who pass the clerking test.

WE HIGHLY RECOMMEND THAT ALL CLERKS TAKE THE ONLINE VERSION OF THE TEST
Immediate feedback is provided for incorrect answers, which both promotes learning and increases test scores.

ONLINE TEST INSTRUCTIONS

All clerks listed in the Online Almanac clerks list were sent an email containing instructions for the online test and this link to the online test: <https://www.classmarker.com/online-test/start/?quiz=met5e934989369d3>

It may be helpful to mark your answers on the hardcopy test first and then enter the answers online. You will be asked to enter your email address, which should be the same email address where the online test link notice was sent, and also to create a password. You may then start the test. There is an option to start a new test or resume a previous test, allowing you the opportunity to work on the test over time or complete it all at once. When the test is completed, you will submit the test and will be notified immediately which questions you missed and if you passed the test. If you did not pass the test, you may retake it.

HARDCOPY TEST INSTRUCTIONS

If you choose to take the hardcopy version of the test, once completed send ONLY one page with your answers to the Central Office. Please keep the printed test to review answers if any were marked incorrectly. Hardcopy test results WILL be slower than online results; you are strongly encouraged to utilize the online testing platform if at all possible.

Show Rules

For the following 25 questions, use the current season show rules to answer whether the statement is true or false.

1. The clerk is in complete charge of their ring.

- a) True b) False

2. If a final is immediately following the class judging due to the small number of entries, then with the judge's permission, the ring clerk may remove the awards after verifying that they have all been recorded.

- a) True b) False

3. No one shall remove the cat's number or award from the judging cage until the entry has been removed from the judging cage.

- a) True b) False

4. Class judging takes priority over finals except in cases of an emergency, i.e. a judge is put in a position of missing their plane, and needs cats from another ring(s) to complete their finals. In this case the show manager is to be notified by the judge requesting a change in schedule so this can be arranged. It will be expected that the judge doing their finals in this situation will do so in a timely manner so not to hold up class judging unduly in the other ring(s).

5. The exhibitor is responsible for notifying ALL chief ring clerks of the action taken when the judge in a ring disqualifies any cat or kitten that bites or that, in the judge's judgment, is behaving in a recalcitrant or threatening manner.

6. All judges' color class sheets must be signed by the judge. All judges shall mark the Best and Second Best of Breed or Division as well as Best Champion of Breed or Division and Best Premier of Breed or Division on the judges' color class sheets, if the judge determines these awards at the completion of judging the breed or division. If the breed or division wins are not awarded at the completion of the breed or division, the judge's sheet will not be submitted to the master clerk without the wins marked.

7. The official CFA (white) copies of the judges' color class sheets don't need to be checked and initialed by the chief ring clerk and the master clerk.

8. The master clerk is responsible for initialing and posting the official (white) copies of the color class sheets that have been fully checked. The sheets should be posted in a manner readily accessible to all exhibitors. The judges' finals sheets must be checked and signed by the master clerk. The master clerk must immediately post the sheets in a manner readily accessible to all exhibitors.

9. A judge shall mark a "dash" (i.e. "--") in the awards column on their color class sheets for any cat judged that does not receive a 1, 2, or 3, except where disqualification or withhold is given by the judge. The judge will also mark a dash for cats handled in the Miscellaneous class. When a cat is judged but receives less than third place in a class, the chief ring clerk shall clearly mark in the judge's copy of the catalog a dash (—) in the area where an award would have been placed. This indicates the cat was handled and judged but received less than third in its class.

11. For cats judged in Household Pet competition, the judge shall mark an "M" for merit for all cats handled and not disqualified. For cats judged in veterans competition, the judge shall mark a "V" for all cats handled.

The chief ring clerk shall mark a catalog as the ribbons and rosettes are placed on the cages, indicating 1st, 2nd, 3rd, Best/Second Best of Color Class, Best/Second Best of Breed/Division, Best Champion/Best Premier of Breed/Division, Merit Awards for HHP (mark M in judge's book/catalog) and Veterans (mark V in judge's book/catalog) and all Finals awards. All absentees and transfers including competitive transfers after the first day of a two day show must be clearly marked. The chief ring clerk must NEVER mark his catalog using the judge's colorclass sheets.

13. Judges' color class sheets and finals sheets must be checked and initialed by the chief ring clerk only.

Ethics and Etiquette

Being a good clerk is not easy. You must go to a clerking school, know the rules and review the clerking manual. Not everything is covered in those tools, such as ethics and etiquette. Sometimes a clerk will need to juggle interesting personalities, as well as dealing with an occasional difficult cat situation. We are all human and occasionally make mistakes. The important thing is that this test will help you learn from others' mistakes. Remember, you are an ambassador to CFA and your demeanor will reflect on the CFA and the club who hired you.

26. Using a polite tone of voice while announcing a grooming call shortly before calling a class of entries is:

- a) Required, it's stated in the clerking manual
- b) Courtesy, it helps people prepare for the ring and avoid second calls

27. When you ring clerk, your place is to be in the ring with your judge. You should not go watch your cat be judged in other rings or the finals.

28. When an exhibitor comes to the clerk at a last minute to request special benching for their cat, absentee them or say they are present, a clerk should do the following.

31. Clerks who are either working in another ring or not, should tell the officiating clerk how to run the ring more efficiently like they do.

32. In addition to using a polite voice, what is the best way to call cats to the ring AND get the exhibitors’ attention?

44. When the master clerk is trying to check out the judges at the end of a show, is it acceptable for them to be so focused on their work that they ignore the requests of the exhibitors to see the final sheets or look at judges' paperwork not yet posted or spectators asking questions?

- a) Yes, checking out judges is the number one priority so they can catch flights. Exhibitors can wait until all are checked out.

 - Sex the cards as you go along before each class and pull the absentees at that time
47. If an exhibitor sees a judge talking to the clerk after handling a cat, then asks the clerk what the judge whispered, should you reveal what was said?
- Yes, unless the judge tells you not to say anything
 - No, whatever is said between the judge and clerk is confidential
48. What if a clerk needs to leave for transportation reasons before the master clerk has the judge checked out?
- Give the catalog to the judge with instructions not to open it.
 - Leave the catalog on the table for the judge to pick up after getting final page back from the master clerk.
 - Ask the master clerk to take the catalog and apologize to the judge for needing to leave early.
 - Ask another exhibitor to hold onto it.
49. There can be lots of activity in ring at once, with stewards cleaning cages, the clerk putting up cage cards and the judge taking cats out for judging. How should the activity be handled when a judge is handling an upset cat or has a cat on the table?
- Never walk in front of the judging table whether the cat is calm or not. You never know what could startle a cat and ruin their show career.
 - Stay still wherever you are when you hear or see a judge handling a difficult cat, then tell the steward not to move until the cat is back in the cage. Motion to the audience to stay still as well.

50. What is the best order of checking judges' sheets for the master clerk?
- Copy placements from the judge's sheet to master clerk catalog while checking mechanics
- Check preliminary slip for mechanics with the judge's Divisional sheet
- Post final to master clerk Finals sheet then compare master clerk Final sheet to Judge's Final sheet
 - Copy placements from the judge's sheet to master clerk catalog
- Check preliminary slip for mechanics with the judge's Divisional sheet
- Compare preliminary final slip to judge's Final sheet
 - Copy placements from the judge's sheet to master clerk catalog while checking mechanics
- Mark breeds on pre-printed divisional sheet then compare divisional to judges' Divisional sheet, sign it
- Check preliminary slip for mechanics with master clerk divisional, post final to master clerk Finals sheet then compare master clerk Final sheet to Judge's Final sheet, sign it
 - Any of the above.
51. If an entry is disqualified for biting or having undescended testicle, the judge must make a notation of DISQ/Bite or DISQ/UT. The clerk should be sure it is there and check if BITE or UT is applicable for an unidentified DISQ. The master clerk MUST post the DISQ/Bite or DISQ/BITE in the master clerk catalog.
- True, CFA needs to be able to track how many times a cat is DISQ for biting and having undescended testicles because they cannot be shown if they receive a total of three.
 - False, it is only for the judge in case an exhibitor questions why they didn't get awards.
52. Count must be announced and should be ready as soon as possible for exhibitors.
- True, it is important for exhibitors to know what the count is so they can calculate their points.
 - False, announcing the count over the microphone interferes with ring announcements and the show rules only govern that the count is ready by the end of the show.

53. At the end of the show, all cage cards should be returned in numerical order and all the same color facing front.

- a) True, it is a polite thing to do for the next clerk who uses them.

54. If a judge asks for your opinion or to pick the last cat for the final, whether it is championship, kittens, premiership or household pets, how should you handle it?

55. While clerking, it is not acceptable to talk about your cat to the judges, how the show is going for your cat or what the judges did for your cat the last time it was seen by them.

Mechanics

For the mechanics section of the test you are going to act as the Chief Ring Clerk checking the judge's pages and looking for mistakes that are fairly common mistakes made. You will be asked to answer questions about the errors you find. To clarify, a mistake or error is anything that would cause the Master Clerk to stop working and return the page (ex: missing color award, nothing marked, reversed awards, duplicate numbers, forgot to sign page, etc). If there is an error in any part of the breed awards (reversed award, forgot to mark them, etc) that will count as one mistake. Be sure you are marking the right letter for that number of mistakes/errors. To help avoid errors, you may find it helpful to print out the judges pages and look at them more easily.
